CASE\_DESCRIPTION: Rafael Iglesias went to a 9-11 fund raiser for the fifth or sixth year as an organizer and worker. After the event ended he was socializing with firefighters when bouncers broke up a fight of two unknown female patrons. As Iglesias walked past the bouncer breaking up the fight he was accidentally elbowed in the face and put his hand up defensively and pushed the offending elbow away from his face. The bouncer turned around and said "Now you have to go, you touched a bouncer." As he and his fellow firefighters tried to explain, the bouncers grabbed Iglesias, under each arm, dragging him out the back. His feet dangling on the ground, he was taken to the back patio by two 6'5" bouncer's who then opened the gate and threw him backwards where he landed on his right hand, fracturing it. First, the bouncers said he was

drunk and fought back, and then they said he tripped over his feet. They told the police that he tripped over his feet after turning around. At trial, they said he tripped over the gate as he was "escorted" out of the back patio gate. The gate had a 2" frame on all four sides, including the threshold. The jury didn't find the bouncer's multiple versions credible.

**INJURY\_DESCRIPTION:** Right Radius and Ulna fracture with internal fixation open reduction (7 screws and a plate) Carpel Tunnel nerve release.

**OTHER\_COMMENTS:** The Judge charged falsus in uno, falsus omnibus and Plaintiff pointed out how many different versions the defendants espoused. Plaintiff's witness, fellow firefighter Gregory Beach was consistent with Iglesias and explained they were mere acquaintances. The bar manager Brian Dunne said he did not know if all the bouncers were recently fired for "heavy-handedness". Plaintiff's counsel suggesting the bar "cleaned house".
